
# The Survey

- 401 provosts from public, private nonprofit and forprofit institutions responded.
- All responses are completely anonymous, but coded by sector.
- Survey conducted by Hanover Research.
- Survey sponsors are Wiley, Honorlock, Interfolio, Coursedog and Watermark.

Please indicate your level of agreement with the following statement: Tenure remains important and viable at my institution. (n=382)




#### The Future of Tenure

- More than three-quarters of provosts report that their institution relies significantly on non-tenure-track faculty for instruction, and most do not expect this level of reliance to change in the future.
- 66% expect their institution to be as reliant on non-tenure-track faculty members in the future as it is today. More (27%) expect their institution to become more reliant than less reliant (7%).




# Some Progress on Helping Those Off the Tenure Track




Better recognition of the roles of those who are teachers only


#### Academic Health -- I

- But if you ask more questions...




### **Academic Health -- II**




### **Liberal Arts Education -- I**




#### **Liberal Arts Education -- II**

Please indicate your level of agreement with the following statements: (n=373)




# STEM vs. Other Departments

Most provosts anticipate major allocation of funds to STEM fields and professional or preprofessional programs in the next budget year. And more than half of provosts anticipate major allocation of funds to online programs (55 percent).


However, only 30 percent anticipate that arts and sciences programs will be prioritized in the next budget year.

To what extent do you believe faculty currently feel... (n=400)




At your institution, who is primarily responsible for ensuring faculty are supported, engaged, and connected? (n=400)
