# Kleberg County & City of Kingsville Confirm Two Additional COVID -19 Related Deaths, Six Additional COVID-19 Cases and a Region 11 Reporting Backlog

KINGSVILLE, TX – Kleberg County Judge Rudy Madrid and the City of Kingsville Mayor Sam Fugate received confirmation from the Texas Department of State Health Services, Region 11 of two additional COVID-19 related deaths and six additional COVID-19 cases. Both the Judge and Mayor were also informed about a backlog in Department of State Health Services, Region 11 reporting that will add an additional 223 cases to our cumulative case count. All 223 individuals were notified of positive test results and placed in quarantine. None of those cases remain active tonight.

The newly confirmed novel coronavirus cases raise our cumulative count in Kleberg County to 902. To date, there have been 29 COVID-19-related deaths. There were 14 individuals removed from isolation tonight, decreasing our active confirmed COVID-19 case count to 130. Region 11 is no longer reporting transmission type, but they are reporting pervasive community spread of COVID-19 in our region. All individuals confirmed with active cases are in isolation and will continue to be monitored by Region 11.

Both city and county leaders are stressing the importance of following all CDC guidelines and recommendations. Please remember to socially distance, wear masks when distancing is not possible and frequently wash your hands. Stay home if you feel sick and isolate if you test positive for COVID-19.

Since March there have been **902 confirmed cases** of novel coronavirus in Kleberg County and **two probable cases**. Tonight's newly confirmed cases are as follows:

- A man in his 20's.
- A girl in her teens.
- A man in his 40's.

- A boy in his teens.
- A woman in her 40's.
- A man in his 60's.
