




The Current Landscape of Higher Ed


Envisioning What's Ahead, With Mission in Mind





Steve Mintz's 3 Challenges

- Business model challenge requires "cost savings, higher student retention rates and revenue enhancements.
- Student satisfaction challenge demands cohorts, more mentoring, high-impact practices, experiential learning.
- Political challenge requires emphasizing collaboration over competition.

John Simon on "Owning the Future"

Strategic Planning? Try Redesigning Instead

- 1. Planners plan designers solve problems.
- 2. Use constraints to encourage creativity.
- 3. Determine constituents' needs, which may not be what they say they need.
- 4. Engage in prototyping.
- 5. Resource the early adopters, and let consensus follow later.
- 6. Don't try to do everything.
