



"First, blended learning is any formal education program in which a student learns at least in part through online learning, with some element of student control over time, place, path, and/or pace."

"In a blended-learning course, for example, students might attend a class taught by a teacher in a traditional classroom setting, while also independently completing online components of the course outside of the classroom."

Long-term question: how will institutions strategically integrate technologically enabled elements into instructional delivery?




Short-term problem: how do colleges changing/conflicting expectations/demands of students and professors?
