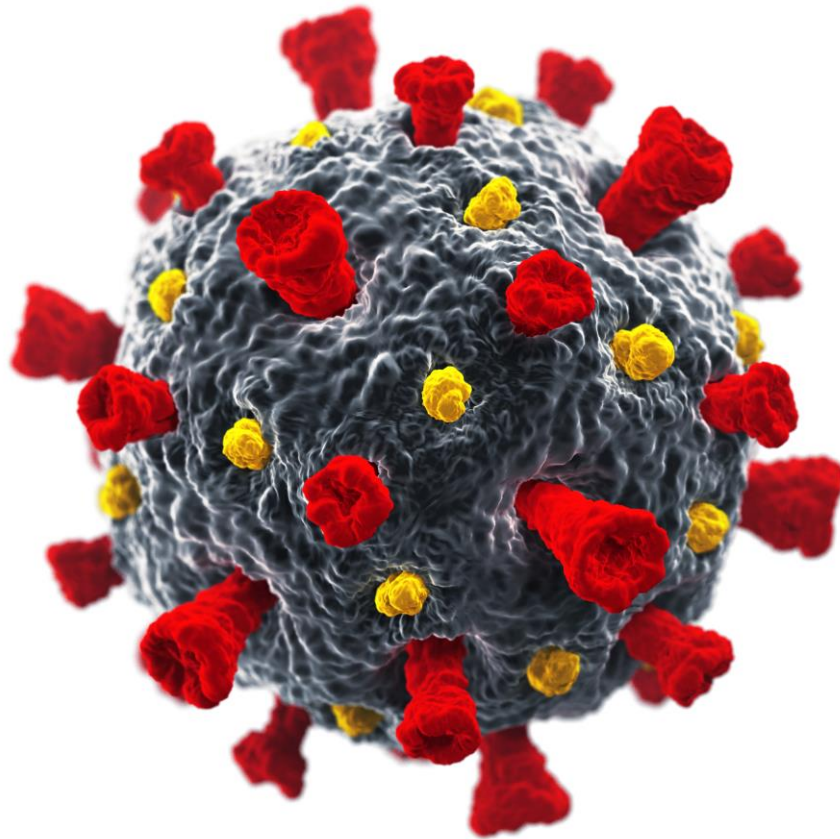

The Biden plan

- \$35 billion for colleges and universities.
- The second plan approved by (the last) Congress was \$21 billion.

The Biden Fact Sheet

“This \$35 billion in funding will be directed to public institutions, including community colleges, as well as public and private Historically Black Colleges and Universities and other minority-serving institutions.”

Biden and Loans

- Biden has said he will continue the moratorium on student loans that borrowers have to repay until Sept. 30.
- Biden pledged during the campaign to cancel \$10,000 of each borrowers' debt "immediately."
- What will he just do, and what will he seek legislation to do?

Race and Ethnicity

- Biden is a strong supporter of affirmative action, but may have little influence over the Supreme Court.
- Biden is a strong supporter of HBCUs and minority-serving institutions.

Labor

- On labor issues (grad student unions at private colleges etc.), Biden is expected to appoint pro-labor members to the NLRB, but change won't be immediate.

For-Profit Colleges

- Trump administration opposed just about every regulation.
- Biden is expected to restore regulation of the sector.
