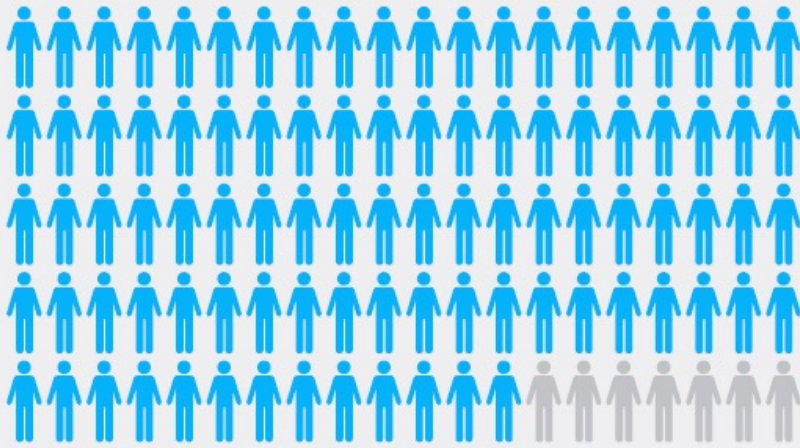

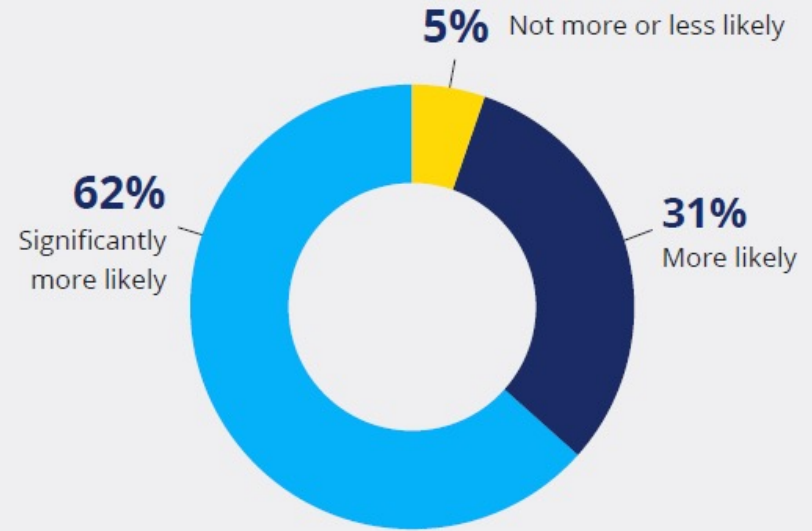

- It has grown during the pandemic.
- Many students report increased anxiety.
- Many faculty members are concerned about student privacy.

# The Approach of Punishing

- It doesn't work – every new punishment has spurred cheaters to create a way to get around it.
- It takes a lot of time to punish students (fairly).
- Many students don't know that what they are doing is wrong.

# Important to Remember

- Just because you were taught about academic integrity in middle school or high school does not mean it's still being taught.

# What Needs to Be Taught

- An understanding of academic dishonesty.
- Attribution, including both the basics and sophisticated measures.
- The value of independent and group work.
- Strategies and resources to manage academic stress.
