Academic Concerns

What college students say they are concerned about to complete coursework and get good grades for 2021-22 year:

- --Feeling unmotivated: 65%
- --Difficulty concentrating: 58%
- --Mental health: 50%
- --Feeling behind academically: 48%
- --Physical health concerns due to COVID-19: 22%



Significance of Academic Concerns

- They are all broad.
- They all are present at all kinds of institutions.

What Is Success?

It all depends....

A 40 percent graduation rate can be a great success. A 90 percent rate may mean no one is paying attention. Or a 40 percent rate may suggest serious problems and a 90 percent rate can suggest lots of great work.
